We would like to remind our clients that there may not be a product warranty offered from the product manufacturer when ordering from an on-line pharmacy provider. If an on-line pharmacy provider contact's us pertaining to a request, we will let them know that we have contacted our clients. The faxing of requests or prescriptions to an on-line pharmacy provider will be our client's responsibility.

As stated by the AVMA (American Veterinary Medical Association) (AVMA link: https://www.avma.org/prescriptions-and-pharmacies-pet-owners-faq) we are required to prescribe medications in 1 of 3 ways;

- 1. Provide medication from our hospital
- 2. Call in or provide a written prescription to a local pharmacy
- 3. Provide a written prescription so YOU can get the medication online

- Are counterfeit

- Are not FDA approved (haven't been checked for safety and effectiveness)
- May not be safe with other medications or products that your pet is taking
- Are not labeled, stored, or shipped correctly
